



# **Articulation Agreement Between**

## Belmont College, AAS Criminal Justice and Wheeling University, BA Criminal Justice

### **Purpose**

The purpose of this agreement is to set guidelines for establishing a cooperative relationship between Belmont College Wheeling University and to facilitate mobility of students who have completed their Associate in Applied Science in Criminal Justice, and desire now to complete a baccalaureate degree in Criminal Justice.

#### **Agreement**

Whereas Belmont College and Wheeling University are committed to expanding the educational opportunities for Criminal Justice students, and

Whereas the two institutions are committed to providing a smooth transition for students wishing to earn and associate degree and a baccalaureate degree, and

Whereas the intent of the two institutions is to avoid duplication of curricula where appropriate within the articulated program of study, and

Whereas the two institutions can better serve the educational growth of students and the economic development of the community through cooperative educational planning and optimal utilization of community resources, and

**Be it Resolved** that this agreement commits the partners to fully support an articulation process between similar academic programs offered by the two institutions.

#### **Mutual Terms and Conditions**

- 1. Both educational institutions will cooperate toward developing, disseminating and presenting the articulated program information to students.
- 2. Graduates of the Belmont College Criminal Justice program who have completed the Associate in Applied Science degree will automatically be accepted into the BA Criminal Justice program at Wheeling University.
- 3. Students transferring from Belmont College may transfer credits, up to a maximum of 62 credit hours toward their baccalaureate degree. Students must complete a minimum of 58 credit

hours at Wheeling University to be eligible for a Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice.

Note, should a Belmont College student have additional transfer credit hours, beyond the credits required for the AAS in Criminal Justice, those credits will be evaluated by Wheeling University to determine their applicability to the BA in Criminal Justice.

- 4. Students are subject to the policies and procedures of both institutions.
- 5. Students intending to transfer should complete the admissions process at Wheeling University during the last semester of their associate degree program.
- A Curriculum Equivalency Guide has been created by Wheeling University and Belmont College
  to identify courses that will effectively transfer and prepare Belmont College students for
  success in the Wheeling University program.
- 7. Both parties will comply with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and all associated regulations, taking the necessary steps to ensure that confidential personal information is not disclosed or distributed.
- 8. All parties agree to continue their respective policies of nondiscrimination based on Title IV of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 in regard to sex, age, race, color, creed and National origin, and other applicable laws as well as the provision of the American Disabilities Act.
- To the extent permitted by law, Belmont College and Wheeling University shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless its agents and employees from any claims, demands or causes of action arising out of negligent acts or omissions of duty.
- 10. The term of this agreement is for 3 years from the date of execution and shall automatically renew for successive one year periods unless a party gives notice of non-renewal 12 months in advance of the expiration of the applicable term.
- 11. Both institutions, Belmont College and Wheeling University, may at any time initiate changes to this articulation agreement. Both institutions reserve the right to modify programs as deemed necessary and agree to inform the appropriate individuals of said changes.
